Drodzy Bracia i Siostry,

W uroczystość Objawienia Pańskiego przypominamy sobie o głębokim znaczeniu światła przebijającego się przez ciemność. Podróż Trzech Króli symbolizuje powszechne poszukiwanie prawdy i duchowego przebudzenia. Gdy kontemplujemy objawienie boskości, obyśmy i my byli prowadzeni przez światło mądrości, dobrot i zrozumienia w naszych własnych podróżach. Niech to objawienie zainspiruje nas do poszukiwania głębszych więzi, przyjęcia różnorodności i dzielenia się darami współczucia i miłości ze wszystkimi, których spotykamy.

Objawienie Pańskie rezonuje z implikacjami życiowymi, które wykraczają poza kontekst religijny. Wzywa nas do uznania, że momenty objawienia nie ograniczają się do konkretnej wiary, ale są uniwersalnymi przebudzeniami w naszym ludzkim doświadczeniu. Uroczystość Objawienia Pańskiego służy jako ponadczasowe przypomnienie o bezgranicznej miłości Boga, miłości, która przekracza granice i dociera do głębi każdego ludzkiego serca. Wzywa nas do refleksji nad boską obecnością w naszym życiu i do hojnego dzielenia się tą miłością z innymi. Obyśmy w naszych interakcjach naśladowali bezwarunkową miłość ukazaną w Epifanii, wspierając więzi, które wypełniają luki i rozpraszają ciemność.
