FATHER MARSHALL

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today we celebrate the second Sunday of Easter. Easter is celebrated from the Easter Vigil to the great feast of Pentecost. Fifty days to celebrate!

The Gospel for the Second Sunday of Easter is the same every year. This should alert us to the significance of the encounters with the resurrected Jesus described in this reading. This Gospel combines two scenes: Jesus' appearance to his disciples after his Resurrection and Jesus' dialogue with Thomas, the disciple who doubted.

It is significant that Jesus appeared to his disciples not in spirit but in bodily form. In his resurrected body, Jesus was no longer bound by space; he appeared to his disciples in spite of the locked door. Yet, on this resurrected body, the disciples could still observe the marks of the crucifixion.

In today's Gospel, Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus also commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun. This continuity with Jesus' own mission is an essential element of the Church. Our parish ministry is a continuation of Jesus' ministry. Jesus grants the means to accomplish this mission when he gives his disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Thomas, the disciple who doubts, represents the reality of the Church that comes after this first community of disciples. All but the first disciples of Jesus must believe without seeing. We are more like Thomas in many ways.

Thomas is given the opportunity to be our representative who obtains this evidence. He gives witness to us that the Jesus who was raised is the same Jesus who has died.

Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are among those who are blessed for we have not seen and yet have believed!

PADRE MARSHALL

Estimados Hermanos y Hermanas,

Hoy celebramos el segundo domingo de Pascua. La Pascua se celebra desde la Vigilia Pascual hasta la gran fiesta de Pentecostés. ¡Cincuenta días para celebrar!

El Evangelio del Segundo Domingo de Pascua es el mismo todos los años. Esto debería alertarnos sobre el significado de los encuentros con Jesús resucitado descritos en esta lectura. Este Evangelio combina dos escenas: la aparición de Jesús a sus discípulos después de su Resurrección y el diálogo de Jesús con Tomás, el discípulo que dudaba.

Es significativo que Jesús se apareció a sus discípulos no en espíritu sino en forma corporal. En su cuerpo resucitado, Jesús ya no estaba limitado por el espacio; se apareció a sus discípulos a pesar de que la puerta del cuarto estaba cerrada. Sin embargo, en este cuerpo resucitado, los discípulos aún podían observar las marcas de la crucifixión.

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús saluda a sus discípulos con el don de la paz y el don del Espíritu Santo. Jesús también comisiona a sus discípulos para que continúen las obras que él ha comenzado. Esta continuidad, con la propia misión de Jesús es un elemento esencial de la Iglesia. Nuestro ministerio parroquial es una continuación del ministerio de Jesús. Jesús concede los medios para cumplir esta misión cuando les da a sus discípulos el don del Espíritu Santo.

Tomás, el discípulo que duda, representa la realidad de la Iglesia que viene después de esta primera comunidad de discípulos. Todos menos los primeros discípulos de Jesús deben creer sin ver. Somos más como Tomás en muchos aspectos.

Tomás tiene la oportunidad de ser nuestro representante que obtiene esta evidencia. Él nos da testimonio de que el Jesús que resucitó es el mismo Jesús que murió.

¡Por el don del Espíritu Santo, somos de los bendecidos porque no hemos visto y hemos creído!

OJCIEC MARSHALL

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry,

Dziś obchodzimy drugą niedzielę Wielkanocy. Wielkanoc jest obchodzona od Wigilii Paschalnej aż do wielkiego święta, którym jest zesłanie Ducha Świętego. Mamy pięćdziesiąt dni do świętowania!

Ewangelia w drugą Niedzielę Wielkanocną jest co roku taka sama. Powinno to nam uświadomić znaczenie spotkań ze zmartwychwstałym Jezusem opisanych w tym czytaniu. Ta Ewangelia łączy w sobie dwie rzeczy: ukazanie się Jezusa uczniom po zmartwychwstaniu oraz dialog Jezusa z Tomaszem, uczniem, który zwątpił.

Znaczące jest to, że Jezus ukazał się swoim uczniom nie tylko w duchu, ale także w postaci cielesnej. W swoim zmartwychpowstałym ciele, Jezus już nie był związany przestrzenią; ukazał się swoim uczniom pomimo zamkniętych drzwi. Jednak w tym zmartwychpowstałym ciele uczniowie dalej widzieli ślady ukrzyżowania.

W dzisiejszej Ewangelii Jezus pozdrawia swoich uczniów darem pokoju i darem Ducha Świętego. Jezus zleca także swoim uczniom kontynuowanie rozpoczętej przez siebie pracy. Ta ciągłość misji Jezusa jest istotnym elementem Kościoła. Nasza posługa parafialna jest kontynuacją posługi Jezusa. Jezus dał nam środki do wypełnienia tej misji, kiedy zesłał swoim uczniom dar Ducha Świętego.

Tomasz, uczeń, który wątpi, reprezentuje rzeczywistość Kościoła, ta która nastąpiła po pierwszej wspólnocie uczniów. Wszyscy z nas, oprócz pierwszych uczniów Jezusa musimy wierzyć, nie widząc. Pod wieloma względami jesteśmy bardzo podobni do Tomasza.

Tomasz jest naszym przedstawicielem, bo on uzyskał te dowody. On daje nam świadectwo, że Jezus, który zmartwychwstał, jest tym samym Jezusem, który umarł.

Dzięki darowi Ducha Świętego jesteśmy pośród błogosławionych, bo nie widzieliśmy, a uwierzyliśmy!
