Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Happy third Sunday of Easter! The readings today focus on Peter and two disciples of Jesus whose lives were touched by Jesus when he walked on the Earth. The Acts of the Apostles and the First Letter of Peter reveal to us what can happen if we allow the Holy Spirit into our lives. Peter, who had denied Jesus three times, is now standing boldly among the people, proclaiming the risen Jesus and what is possible when the Holy Spirit comes into the lives of believers. Peter, who had run away in fear at the time of Jesus' arrest is reflecting on passages from scripture and explaining their connection to Jesus. Peter states very clearly that not only has Jesus risen and ascended to the Father but that it is through the power of the Holy Spirit being sent that Peter and the other followers of Jesus are able to perform the works they do and profess the fact of Jesus is indeed risen from the dead.

The two disciples who meet Jesus on the road are walking away from Jerusalem at the beginning of the Gospel and at the end of the passage are walking back to Jerusalem to proclaim what they experienced in their encounter with Jesus.

What does any of this have to do with us? Our lives are so different than those who lived at that time. However, our hearts are the same. Each time we attend Mass we experience the "breaking of the bread" which Jesus asked us to do in memory of him. The two disciples recognized Jesus "in the breaking of the bread."

Do we give ourselves a chance to focus on what is happening at the Consecration and Elevation of the bread and wine at Mass, and Who is present for us on the altar? Do we allow ourselves to recognize Jesus in the depths of our hearts and go forth to enthusiastically proclaim that He is indeed risen, and has sent his Holy Spirit on us, just as he did on the apostles and disciples?

Let us seek Jesus as we live our daily lives. Let us adjust our spiritual lenses and change our perspective asking Jesus to "show us the path of life" and let us accept the fact that the Holy Spirit has come upon us and impels us to return to our everyday Jerusalems and share the Good News. . . that Jesus died for our sins, was raised up and through Him we have the gift of eternal life. Amen, Alleluia!

Queridas hermanas y hermanos,

¡Feliz tercer domingo de Pascua! Las lecturas de hoy se enfocan en Pedro y dos discípulos de Jesús cuyas vidas fueron tocadas por Jesús cuando caminó sobre la Tierra. Los Hechos de los Apóstoles y la Primera Carta de Pedro nos revelan lo que puede suceder si permitimos que el Espíritu Santo entre en nuestra vida. Pedro, quien había negado a Jesús tres veces, ahora está de pie con valentía entre la gente, proclamando a Jesús resucitado y lo que es posible cuando el Espíritu Santo viene a la vida de los creyentes. Pedro, que había huido atemorizado en el momento del arresto de Jesús, reflexiona sobre pasajes de las Escrituras y explica su conexión con Jesús. Pedro afirma muy claramente que Jesús no solo ha resucitado y ha ascendido al Padre, sino que es a través del poder del enviado Espíritu Santo que Pedro y los demás seguidores de Jesús pueden realizar las obras y profesan el hecho de que Jesús ciertamente ha resucitado de entre los muertos.

Los dos discípulos que se encuentran con Jesús en el camino se alejan de Jerusalén al comienzo del Evangelio y al final del pasaje regresan a Jerusalén para proclamar lo que vivieron en su encuentro con Jesús.

¿Qué tiene que ver todo esto con nosotros? Nuestras vidas son tan diferentes a las que ellos vivieron en ese tiempo. Sin embargo, nuestros corazones son iguales. Cada vez que asistimos a Misa experimentamos la “fracción del pan” que Jesús nos pidió que hiciéramos en su memoria. Los dos discípulos reconocieron a Jesús en la “fracción del pan”.

¿Nos damos la oportunidad de enfocarnos en lo que está sucediendo en la Consagración y Elevación del pan y el vino en la Misa y Quién está presente en el altar? ¿Nos permitimos reconocer a Jesús en lo más profundo de nuestro corazón y salimos a proclamar con entusiasmo que efectivamente ha resucitado y ha enviado sobre nosotros su Espíritu Santo, como lo hizo sobre los apóstoles y discípulos?

Busquemos a Jesús mientras vivimos nuestra vida diaria. Ajustemos nuestros lentes espirituales y cambiemos nuestra perspectiva pidiéndole a Jesús que “nos muestre el camino de la vida” y aceptemos que el Espíritu Santo ha venido sobre nosotros y nos impulsa a regresar a nuestra Jerusalén cotidiana y compartir la Buena Nueva. . . que Jesús murió por nuestros pecados, resucitó y por medio de Él tenemos el don de la vida eterna. ¡Amén, Aleluya!

SIOSTRA DIANE MARIE COLLINS

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry,

Szczęśliwej trzeciej niedzieli wielkanocnej! Dzisiejsze czytania koncentrują się na Piotrze i dwóch uczniach Jezusa, których życie zostało dotknięte przez Jezusa, kiedy chodził po ziemi. Dzieje Apostolskie i Pierwszy List Piotra mówią nam, co się stanie, jeśli pozwolimy Duchowi Świętemu wejść w nasze życie. Piotr, który trzykrotnie zaparł się Jezusa, teraz odważnie stoi wśród ludzi, głosząc zmartwychwstałego Jezusa, to jest możliwe, kiedy Duch Święty wkracza w życie wierzących. Piotr, który uciekł ze strachu w czasie aresztowania Jezusa, zastanawia się nad fragmentami z Pisma Świętego i wyjaśnia ich związek z Jezusem. Piotr stwierdza bardzo wyraźnie, że nie tylko Jezus zmartwychwstał i wstąpił do Ojca, ale że to dzięki mocy zesłanego Ducha Świętego on i inni naśladowcy Jezusa są w stanie wykonywać dzieła, które wykonują i wyznawać fakt, że Jezus rzeczywiście powstał z martwych.

Dwóch uczniów, którzy spotykali Jezusa na drodze, opuścili Jerozolimę na początku czytania z Ewangelii, ale na końcu tego fragmentu wracają z powrotem do Jerozolimy, aby opowiedzieć o tym, czego doświadczyli w spotkaniu z Jezusem.

Co to wszystko ma wspólnego z nami? Nasze życie jest tak różne od tego, które było w tamtych czasach. Jednak nasze serca są takie same. Za każdym razem, gdy uczestniczymy we Mszy św., doświadczamy „łamania chleba”, o które prosił nas Jezus na Jego pamiątkę. Dwaj uczniowie rozpoznali Jezusa „przy łamaniu chleba”.

Czy dajemy sobie szansę skupienia się na tym, co dzieje się podczas Konsekracji i Podniesienia Chleba i Wina podczas Mszy św. i Kto jest dla nas obecny na ołtarzu? Czy pozwalamy rozpoznać Jezusa w głębi naszych serc i wychodzimy z entuzjazmem głosić, że rzeczywiście zmartwychwstał i zesłał na nas swojego Ducha Świętego, tak jak na apostołów i uczniów?

Szukajmy Jezusa w naszym codziennym życiu. Dostosujmy nasze duchowe soczewki i zmieńmy perspektywę, prosząc Jezusa, aby „pokazał nam drogę życia” i zaakceptujmy fakt, że Duch Święty zstąpił na nas i przynagła do powrotu do naszych codziennych Jerozolim i dzielenia się Dobrą Nowiną że Jezus umarł za nasze grzechy, zmartwychwstał i przez Niego mamy dar życia wiecznego. Amen, Alleluja!
