Drodzy przyjaciele,

Słowa Jezusa z dzisiejszej Ewangelii mają głęboki wpływ na nasze codzienne życie. Jeśli naprawdę Go kochamy, musimy przestrzegać Jego przykazań, a czyniąc to, otrzymamy dar Ducha Świętego, który będzie nas prowadził i zawsze z nami pozostanie.

Siostry i bracia, jesteście wezwani do życia w posłuszeństwie woli Bożej i naśladowania przykładu Jezusa w naszych słowach i czynach. We wszystkich naszych kontaktach z innymi musimy starać się być uczciwymi, życzliwymi i współczującymi oraz kochać naszych bliźnich jak siebie samych.
