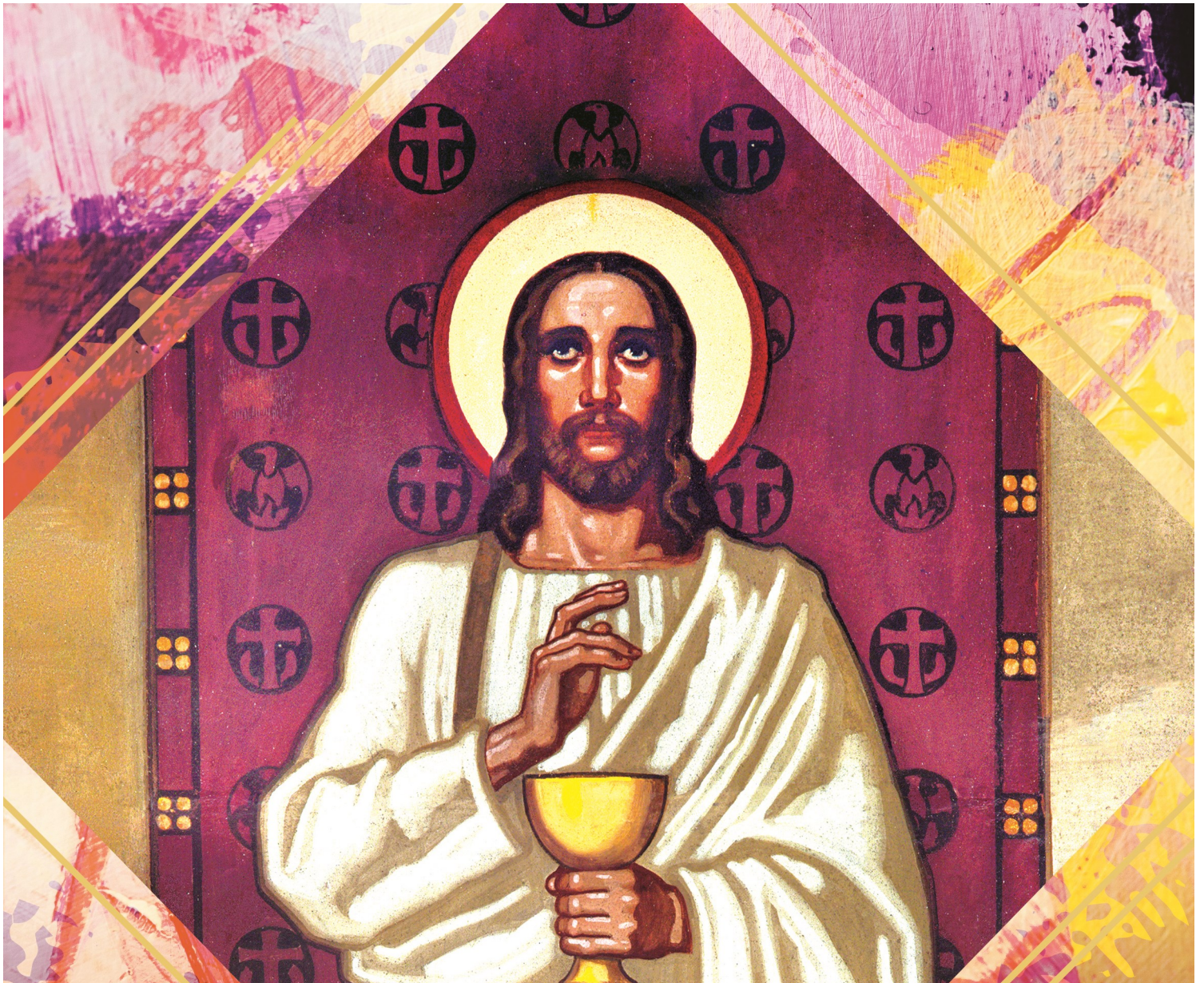

## FATHER TOM

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On the night before giving His life on the cross, Jesus instituted the Eucharist, the gift of his Body and Blood, in the form of bread and wine, as the perpetual passover sacrifice for his followers. This was done in the context of what is traditionally called the Last Supper. The Solemnity we celebrate this Sunday centers on the gift of the Body and Blood of the Lord, which we partake in at Holy Mass (the Eucharist) until the Lord comes again in glory at the end of the ages.

Holy Eucharist is NOT a symbol. The unbroken teaching of the Church is that we behold and receive in the Eucharist the Real Presence of the Risen Lord, who promised to be with us until the end of time. It is a great mystery yet at the same time a simple truth: God-is-with-us in a very special and singular way in the Blessed Sacrament, both received at Holy Communion and adored in the tabernacle or exposed on the altar at Exposition and Benediction.

The Mass, Holy Eucharist, is the sacrifice or offering of the new covenant in the Blood of Christ. It is likewise the offering of the faithful, God's people, united to Jesus in praise of the One God.

We should not come to Mass out of mere obligation, but because the Eucharistic celebration is an integral part of our life in Christ and our communion with others. The celebration and reception of the Eucharist should be our strength and joy, a commitment in faith and love that gives meaning to all our existence.

We aren't Christians because we go to Mass, but we go to Mass because we are Christians, to celebrate God's unbounded love for us and to participate in the action that followers of Christ have engaged in since the Lord walked among his own.

The Mass never ends, we might say, because at the conclusion of every Mass we are "sent forth," to announce the Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ, to the ends of the earth, by our words and especially by our deeds. As tabernacles of the Lord, by receiving His Body and Blood, we are commissioned with a special task that not everyone has embraced: to be "bearers of Christ," to all people, until our final breath. Could there be a higher call?

## PADRE TOM

Estimados Hermanos y Hermanas,

La noche antes de fallecer en la cruz, Jesús instituyó la Eucaristía, el don de su Cuerpo y Sangre, en forma de pan y vino, como perpetuo sacrificio pascual para sus seguidores. Esto se hizo en el contexto tradicionalmente de lo que se llama la Última Cena. La solemnidad que celebramos este domingo se centra en el don del Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor, del cual participamos en la Santa Misa (la Eucaristía) hasta que el Señor regrese en gloria al final del tiempo.

La Sagrada Eucaristía NO es un símbolo. La enseñanza constante de la Iglesia es que contemplamos y recibimos la Presencia Real del Señor Resucitado en la Eucaristía, quien prometió estar con nosotros hasta el final del tiempo. Es un gran misterio pero al mismo tiempo una simple verdad: Dios-está-con-nosotros de una manera muy especial y singular en el Santísimo Sacramento, cuando lo recibimos en la Sagrada Comunión, como lo adoramos en el sagrario o cuando es expuesto en el altar en la Exposición. y Bendición.

La Misa, la Sagrada Eucaristía, son el sacrificio u ofrenda de la nueva alianza en la Sangre de Cristo. Es también la ofrenda de los fieles, el pueblo de Dios, unidos a Jesús en alabanza al Dios Único.

No debemos venir a Misa por mera obligación, sino porque la celebración eucarística es parte integral de nuestra vida en Cristo y de nuestra comunión con los demás. La celebración y recepción de la Eucaristía deben ser nuestra fuerza y alegría, un compromiso en la fe y el amor que da sentido a toda nuestra existencia.

No somos cristianos porque vamos a Misa, pero vamos a Misa porque somos cristianos, para celebrar el amor ilimitado de Dios por nosotros y para participar en la acción que los seguidores de Cristo han realizado desde que el Señor caminó entre los suyos.

La Misa nunca termina, podríamos decir, porque al final de cada Misa somos “enviados” para anunciar la Buena Nueva de la salvación en Jesucristo, hasta los confines de la tierra, con nuestras palabras y especialmente con nuestras obras. Como tabernáculos del Señor, al recibir Su Cuerpo y Sangre, se nos encomienda una tarea especial que no todos han asumido: ser “portadores de Cristo”, para todos los pueblos, hasta nuestro último aliento. ¿Podría haber una llamada más alta?

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry,

W noc poprzedzającą oddanie życia na krzyżu Jezus ustanowił Eucharystię, dar swojego Ciała i Krwi pod postaciami chleba i wina, jako nieustanną ofiarę paschalną dla swoich naśladowców. Uroczystość, którą obchodzimy w tę niedzielę, koncentruje się na darze Ciała i Krwi Pańskiej, w których uczestniczymy we Mszy Świętej (Eucharystii), aż Pan przyjdzie ponownie w chwale na końcu czasów.

Święta Eucharystia NIE jest symbolem. Nieprzerwanym nauczaniem Kościoła jest to, że widzimy i przyjmujemy w Eucharystii rzeczywistą obecność Zmartwychwstałego Pana, który obiecał być z nami aż do końca czasów. Jest to wielka tajemnica, a jednocześnie prosta prawda: Bóg jest z nami w sposób bardzo konkretny i szczególny w Najświętszym Sakramencie, zarówno przyjmowanym w Komunii Świętej, jak i adorowanym w tabernakulum lub wystawionym na ołtarzu podczas wystawienia.

Msza Święta Eucharystia jest ofiarą nowego przymierza we Krwi Chrystusa. Jest to również ofiara wiernych, ludu Bożego, zjednoczonych z Jezusem na cześć Jedyne Boga.

Nie powinniśmy przychodzić na Mszę św. tylko z obowiązku, ale dlatego, że celebrowanie Eucharystii jest integralną częścią naszego życia w Chrystusie i komunii z innymi. Sprawowanie i przyjmowanie Eucharystii powinno być naszą siłą i radością, zaangażowaniem w wiarę i miłość, które nadają sens całemu naszemu życiu.

Nie jesteśmy chrześcijanami, ponieważ chodzimy na Mszę św., ale chodzimy na Mszę, ponieważ jesteśmy chrześcijanami, aby celebrować bezgraniczną miłość Boga do nas i uczestniczyć w akcji, w którą zaangażowali się wyznawcy Chrystusa, odkąd Pan chodził pośród swoich.

Można powiedzieć, że Msza św. nigdy się nie kończy, ponieważ po każdej Mszy jesteśmy „posyłani”, aby głosić Dobrą Nowinę o zbawieniu w Jezusie Chrystusie, aż po krańce ziemi, naszymi słowami, a zwłaszcza naszymi czynami. Jako tabernakulum Pana, przyjmując Jego Ciało i Krew, otrzymaliśmy specjalne zadanie, którego nie wszyscy podjęli: być „nosicielami Chrystusa” dla wszystkich ludzi, aż do naszego ostatniego tchnienia. Czy może być większe powołanie niż to?
